BACKGROUND: College of the Atlantic is a fully accredited, coeducational four-year college located in Bar Harbor, Maine, offering a Bachelor of Arts (BA) and a Master's of Philosophy (MPhil) in human ecology. COA's high school programs provide rising juniors and seniors with opportunities to reflect on their place in the world and to develop skills to use in college and beyond while earning college credit. We are looking for a select group of students willing to take advantage of a unique educational opportunity at a pivotal moment in their lives. Our classrooms include canoes on the river, farm fields, rocky island shores and the woods and waters of Maine and Acadia National Park. Here students explore the connections between science, art, and the humanities while they engage in an intensive program combining rigorous academic work with field experiences.
