

**Latin Name:** *Pelargonium capitatum*  
**Common Name:** Rose-Scented Pelargonium  
**Family:** Geraniaceae  
**Geographic Origin:** South Africa



Soil: Use an all-purpose soil mix.

Temperature: Temperatures during the day should be between 65°-75°F and should be between 55°-65°F at night.

Light: This plant prefers full sun with some partial shade.

Moisture: Water every two to three days, allowing the soil to dry moderately between each thorough watering.

Fertilization: This plant should be fertilized every other week, alternating between fish and seaweed fertilizers.

Grooming: Repot every two to three years. This plant prefers to be pot-bound. Repot when the roots occupy three-fourths of pot space. Prune to promote bushiness and flowering.

Seasonal Care: Reduce watering and fertilizing during winter months.

Propagation: Propagate through stem cuttings or seeds.

Pests and Diseases: Check for mealy bugs and whitefly.
