

SPRING 2020 SCHEDULE

With all courses being offered online, faculty are making use of a variety of synchronous (real time group meetings at a set time) and asynchronous (resources available to you at any time) options. Many are using some combination of these. Faculty are classifying these using the following levels, listed in the table below:

A - asynchronous – course material is delivered without set real-time schedule

S - synchronous - the students will meet in real-time at least once a week

M - somewhere in the middle. There will be some synchronous course meetings, but much of the course work will be done asynchronously.

O – other; synchronous meetings will be infrequent enough that students could take another course in the same time block .
