Syllabus

In general, we will use the morning and some late afternoons for shooting in the field when the lighting is good. This means that we will be at our shooting location some mornings before sunrise. In the middle of the day, when lighting is not optimal, we will concentrate our time in the graphics lab processing the images that were captured in the morning. However, weather conditions will dictate how we will organize each day. Although lab work will move at a pace that is determined by the participants, individual instruction will be given to address everyone's prior experience and competence as we move forward.
